Types of Decision Drivers (Stage 2, Task 2)

DECISION DRIVER
Threat

ATTRIBUTES AND EXAMPLES

An identified or emerging risk to blood quality that affects blood recipients

A threat to donor safety

A threat to the blood supply, through a demand surge or a reduction of supply or withdrawal of products

May involve high levels of uncertainty

Likely to require risk assessment, economics assessments, and technology evaluations

May require options analysis; comparative assessments; trade-off of risks, benefits, and costs

DECISION DRIVER Intervention

ATTRIBUTES AND EXAMPLES

New intervention

- Consideration of effectiveness, cost, and residual risks of a new intervention (such as a new test or procedure), in some cases in the context of comparing several interventions
- May require regulatory approvals and entail risk of associated delay in implementation

Withdrawal of intervention

- Consideration of withdrawing use of a current intervention (such as a test, procedure, or protocol) in light of an alternative intervention (such as one new test replacing several existing tests)

DECISION DRIVER Priority Setting

ATTRIBUTES AND EXAMPLES

Prioritization for risk assessments, interventions, policies

DECISION DRIVER
Social Concern / Ethics

ATTRIBUTES AND EXAMPLES

Consideration of intervention with a major ethical component or particular social sensitivity

Legal or jurisdictional issues may be relevant

May include stakeholder consultation or similar processes to gain understanding of perceptions and preferred intervention options

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
